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What is a Neighbourhood Standards Agreement (NiSA)?

We believe that everyone should have the right to live in a clean, peaceful and safe environment.

This document is a tool to facilitate a strong working partnership between various agencies and the Parishioners of Ford and clearly outlines which partner is responsible for what; and what we would like you, as Parishioners, to help us with.

It is our hope that we will all work together for the benefit of our Parish and that by engaging with us it will encourage Parishioners to develop a greater interest in our community and inspire people to take more responsibility. The ultimate aim is for the community to play an active part in the decision making processes in the Parish to further enhance the neighbourhood in which we live.

Our commitment

By agreeing to participate in the NiSA, both Parishioners and partners are committing to the well-being of the Parish of Ford, and understand that a "good neighbour" approach, tolerant attitude and respect is needed from everyone, regardless of any differences, along with an awareness of how our own behaviour may have an impact on others.

All partners will work in the Parish to;

- Encourage people to respect each other and be more involved within the community
- Assist Parishioners to resolve problems between themselves
- Prevent problems from happening in the first place
- Tackle the root cause of any problem by sharing information with partners
- Not tolerate crime, anti-social behaviour, vandalism and graffiti
- Take appropriate action to tackle anti-social behaviour, nuisance or crime
- Take all reports of anti-social behaviour seriously and dealing with them sensitively and confidentially and offering support for witnesses

So, what does the NiSA cover?

This NiSA covers the most important issues which were identified by you, the Parishioners, after completing the Ford Parish Questionnaire (see page 24 – Parish Action Plan) in early 2012 and by looking at existing information about the area.

How will this agreement be monitored?

This Neighbourhood Standards Agreement will be reviewed by Ford Parish Council and Severnside Housing following the initial six month period to ensure the Parishioners and partners are delivering what we promise. From then on, it will be reviewed annually.

This will be done by means of a "rate your place" exercise. This is a small questionnaire put together by all partners which will be delivered to all Parishioners. It will ask each resident if they feel the NiSA has made a difference to their area, and if so, how, and if the partners have delivered the actions promised. An annual review will take place thereafter to consider how the scheme might be improved. It will also give an opportunity for the Parish community to decide whether they wish to continue with such a scheme.

To provide regular articles for the Ford Newsletter and so enable Parishioners to know what is happening at Shropshire Council.

I agree to follow the standards of Shropshire Council and will normally contact any resident within 5 days of receiving a request for help, visiting them if needed.





Appendix 2

The Shropshire Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Various Roads, Ford) (Amendment) Order 2011

The Shropshire Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 1(3), 2, 4, 5, 32, 35, 45, 46 and 49 and Part IV of Schedule 9 and having regard to Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984) as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, and with the consent of the Secretary of State for the restrictions on the A458, hereby makes the following order.

- This order shall come into operation on 16 December 2011 and may be cited as The Shropshire Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Various Roads, Ford) (Amendment) Order 2011.
- 2. The Shropshire Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2009 is hereby amended to incorporate the following changes:-

No Waiting At Any Time restrictions will apply on both sides of Butt Lane from its junction with the A458 to the property boundary of Cornerways and The School House, and also from the rear property line of No. 17 West View in the direction of the A458, to the build-out outside Oaklands.


No Waiting At Any Time restrictions will apply on both sides of The Leasowes from where it joins Butt Lane to a point in line with the corner of the main building line of No. 69 The Leasowes.

No Waiting At Any Time restrictions will apply to both sides of West View from the junction with Butt Lane to the property boundary of numbers 17 and 18 West View, also No Waiting At Any Time restrictions will apply on the bend outside number 20 West View from opposite the start of the kerb radius leading in to Quail Ridge to a point midway between the front and rear of 20 West View.

No Waiting At Any Time restrictions will apply to the A458 at the junction with Butt Lane from the start of the kerb radius leading into Butt Lane, outside the property known as Cornerways, to the end of the kerb radius running from Butt Lane on the opposite side of the junction. **Alternative description:** From a point 1.8 metres east of the south-east corner of The School House, Butt Lane to a point 40.3 metres east of the south-east corner of The School House, Butt Lane, and including the junction with Butt Lane.

3. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

Appendix 3

Shropshire Council Road Safety Policy

Guidance for town and parish councils on community led concerns

Introduction

A new Road Safety Policy framework was approved by Shropshire Council's Cabinet on 20th February 2013. The framework enables Shropshire Council traffic engineers to consider what speed management measures will best address a defined problem taking account of road function, accident data analysis and **community led concerns**. In summary, the new policy will result in:-

- An annual programme of schemes rather than predefined lists of schemes for forthcoming years;
- More flexibility for appropriate measures on a site by site basis;
- A consistent approach county-wide;
- A requirement to demonstrate community support, and
- The opportunity to use local funding.

In addition to accident data analysis, road safety schemes can also be generated by a new method for dealing with road safety concerns raised by the local community. The community led concerns element of the Road Safety Policy strengthens the role of town and parish councils and this document provides further guidance on how local road safety concerns will be dealt with.

How will road safety concerns be raised?

Members of the general public will be encouraged to approach town and parish councils directly with any road safety concerns. Town and parish councils will accept requests first and then submit those that they **support**, and consider there to be a level of **shared community concern**, to Shropshire Council.

When will community led concerns be reported to Shropshire Council?

Submissions will be made three times a year (end of February, May and September) to allow officers to undertake discussions with Shropshire Council local members and the police, and to gather any necessary data. It is envisaged that the first collection will be at the end of **May 2013**, however for the first submission lists will be accepted into June 2013.

Town and parish council can continue to raise issues directly with West Mercia Police and the Safer Roads Partnership where enforcement is required.

How will community led concerns be submitted to Shropshire Council?

Town and parish council will need to submit a prioritised list of **up to five** road safety concerns to the local traffic engineering teams. This means that there can be up to fifteen concerns highlighted in any calendar year. The list will need to include details on the specific nature of the concern, the location and its priority (with number 1 being the greatest priority).
