SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL

Report on issues from Shropshire Councillor Roger Evans

It is now February and there are several challenges facing Shropshire Council. The first one I wish to highlight concerns **the council's finances**.

A consultation on the draft budget has just finished and over 1,000 submissions were received. This included comments from just over 300 staff who are rightly concerned at what the future holds for them, the council and Shropshire.

Councils receive an annual grant from government to help pay for all the services they provide. The size of this grant has reduced over the years whilst the costs facing all councils have increased.

The budget set by the Conservatives, who run our council for 2023/24, this current year, stated that reductions and efficiencies of £51m were needed. As usual they failed to deliver what was promised. Reserves have again had to be used, an extra £20.5m put into Social Care as a one off, and, due to other savings also not being achieved a further £14m to balance the budget. This will reduce the reserves to dangerous levels and they will be at the lowest ever level; accountants say a dangerous level.

The council's budget which has just been published now states that during this next budget year, beginning in April, over £62m must be saved.

The savings and cuts listed in the budget for next year are numerous due to previous failings over many years. The list includes by coincidence cutting staff numbers by over 300, charging for every green bin, closing some recycling centres, library provision, costs of school transport and many more/. They have of course also brought in consultants at a cost of over £1m per year to show them how and where more savings can be made.

The cabinet earlier this month proposed increases in carparking charges. These included raising weekday parking fees by up to 67% and weekend ones by around 150%. This, it was estimated would increase the council s income from parking charges by around £2.1m per year, part of which £1.5m would be from the increased charges being levied in Shrewsbury if adopted parking fees would be charged for using council carparks on a Sunday and in the evening until 8.00pm.

I, as your councillor led a fight, a successful fight, to stop these huge increases. This has now been agreed and the Cabinet has been told they need to relook at these proposed increases.

The cabinet have also agreed that a new 8 lane **swimming pool plus a fitness centre** should be built at Sundorne, estimated cost is £28m. A consultation on this will now take place. When

asked about the future of the Quarry, the answer given has been that the future of this site will be considered sometime in the future.

Local Plan. This of course includes the number of, and where, future housing is likely to get planning permission. Work on this started in 2019 and continues. The Planning Inspectors, employed by the Government have responsibility for monitoring and agreeing that the plan meets and complies with all the Government rules. They have now raised further queries which will involve even more delays as they now require another consultation to take place on selected parts of it. This is expected take place during the late spring.

North West Relief Road. (NWRR) The planning application for this road was finally passed (6 votes for and 5 against) by the planning committee a few days ago.

The **Smithfield Riverside Regeneration** work has just started. This involves the demolition of the Riverside Shopping Centre together with alterations to the Gyratory network adjacent to the Railway Station.

A further consultation for this area has just been launched. This concerns Phase 2 of the development.

Former Bowling Green. Two planning Applications concerning this site were discussed at a meeting of the planning committee on 20th February. One was for a meeting hall that will be used by the Plymouth Brethren and the other for a house with an altered access to that which was previously approved.

Both were approved despite both the Parish Council and me raising concerns about them. However, conditions were put in place restricting the use of the meeting hall and also when detailed plans for the house are eventually submitted then that application will again need to be considered by the full committee and not left for officers to approve it.

Weather, Problems involving the flooding of sections of the highway have been raised and it is hoped work will soon be carried out to stop this happening.

Speeding & other traffic problems. A meeting was recently held between the police, your parish councillors and me concerning speeding around the village, access onto and off the A485 into the village, and access to the Garage/shop. The police have agreed to fit a pair of their cameras in two positions along the A485 to measure and record the speed of (cont.)

Vehicles. Registration numbers will not be taken, just the vehicle speed will be recorded. This will help provide data and hopefully help us to push for and achieve both a lowering of the speed limit and that police will regularly check speeds. Discussions have also taken place concerning the continued parking problems outside and adjacent to the school. All these issues were also brought up during the recent visit of the Police and Crime Commissioner when he held an open meeting at the village hall.




