74/1819 PERSONS PRESENT AND ACCEPT APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies received from Cllrs. Jones and Mortimer. It was noted that Cllr. Hanmer had resigned and the vacancy has been duly notified and advertised.

77/1819 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SESSION

The Director of First Choice Design and Developments spoke in relation to her company's interest in site FRD013 (field by Back Lane/A458/Dinky's Dinah). She was interested in bringing together the hub development and wanted to know what the community wants - she had observed issues re the location of the shop, pre-school and traffic congestion. She was suggesting providing a pre-school and gifting it to Shropshire Council and putting a bridge over the brook to Ford Recreation Ground to access it. She had been to Trinity School and spoken to headteacher. As a company, they build high quality developments of a mix of uses. Proposal would be a mix of family homes – 2, 3 and 4 beds and possibly bungalows and apartments and open space. Timescale - small phases, 2020 onwards. Councillors informed her that the parish is against the proposed hub designation. In terms of mix of uses, she was suggesting putting a convenience store on the site and felt this would not adversely affect NISA and would help the parish. She had contacted some retailers, including the Co-op who have expressed an interest. The council highlighted that planning permission was refused on the site before. The chair highlighted that FRD013 is not the preferred site in the LP Review. The chair highlighted that there still a lot of stages in community hub designation process and suggested she come back with more detail at a later date. Cllr. Evans said it was his understanding that the company will submit the site to SC as part of the Local Plan and that SC will carry out further consultation. It was noted that the company has met with the school and is planning to meet with Dinky's Dinah - potentially offering Dinky's Dinah a new shell for his business.

A member of the public spoke regarding an informal consultation to divert a footpath at The Grain Barn Shoothill. It was noted that the path had already been moved unofficially and the member of the public was asked to clarify. He explained that seed had been planted and people are asked to walk round it but can use the official route if they wish. Cllr. Evans had expressed his support to SC officers but he wanted the PC's views as well.

 - Invite for parishes to make bids for CIL (Local) will be followed by a meeting in Spring.
 - Consultation re SC withdrawing Bring Back bins from all SC sites, will save SC £230,000 per annum.
 - Budget consultation £27 million gap, £18 million one-off grants, rest to be filled by reserves and one-offs. Proposal to make £18.5 million savings, relating to cuts. Consultation online until 18th Feb. Key items public health nursing services (school nurses, sexual health advice to people in Wales being withdrawn unclear how this will work, mental health services, waste and recycling £1.5million savings proposal to charge for green bins, concessionary fares on Park & Ride being withdrawn, children's passenger transport services cuts, bus service subsidy cuts. Council Tax overall 3.99% rise proposed.
 - \bullet Local Plan meeting 17^{th} January at Guildhall for Shrewsbury Rural North, including Ford.
- b) Youth Club AGM scheduled for 31st January.
- c) Ford Village Show Cllr. Mortimer had forwarded the accounts which will be reviewed at the next council meeting. In summary, the show was successful, with a surplus of circa £200 on the day. Meeting end of the week re the 2019 show with the PTA at the school. It may be possible to combine the school gala day with Village Show
- d) Ford Village Hall closed w/c 18th Feb for decorating, AGM tomorrow.
- e) Other parish councillor reports Cllr. Briggs reported some anti-social behaviour and suspicious behaviour which has been raised on the parish Facebook page

80/1819 **LOCAL PLAN REVIEW** *–response to the Preferred Sites consultation* It was **RESOLVED** to make the following comments:

Q3 - Cross-subsidy site exception policy – this refers to mixed sites of affordable housing and open market where the open market element is allowed as a policy exception to enable the delivery of affordable housing. It was noted that this type of housing could occur regardless of settlement status – i.e. in both open countryside and community hubs/cluster. Demonstrating need is likely to be a key requirment of the policy. The policy is worded quite vaguely as cross subsidy is a new initiative in national policy and it is difficult to know how it will work in practice. Concern was expressed that it could have an adverse impact on rural areas by railroading development into them. Concern was also expressed that time could be spent carefully considering the development boundary but cross subsidy could go outside of the boundary.

<u>Response:</u> There should be no policy – the policy forces development on rural areas and possibly outside of development boundaries and is more applicable to urban areas.

Q5: Windfall – 19 windfall dwellings proposed. It was queried as to why 28 commitments to date are identified in the Plan when 32 have bene permitted on the site adjacent to Trinity CE School. The clerk said that this was likely to be due to the cut off for calculating completions being 31.3.17 whereas the permission was issued after 31.3.17. Yes.

Q53: Community Hub

Response: Against community hub for the following reasons:

Points – scoring system inflexible, no flexibility re whether have library and what type of library:

- Bus service does not meet criteria re timings. Subsidy for the service under threat.
- Public house not got one, got 2 restaurants

- Library only 10 mins per fortnight
- Outdoor sports facility bowling green not an active or useable facility, condition and private land so not publicly accessible. The PC will look to pursue with Sport England its de-designation
- Superfast broadband 75% to have more than 30mBpS. Haven't got it consistently.
- School capacity
- The village does not have the facilities needed to be a hub
- Traffic issues very busy and dangerous on Butt Lane and the problem will become more acute. The village is already bisected by a busy A road and a bypass would be needed
- People like the countryside character of Ford and do not want more houses.
- 100 houses would make the community unsustainable added
- Minerals safeguarding area Ford is in the middle of a sand and gravel area.
- Development should be focused in villages that want to be community hubs

Q53b – housing survey not a need for more. 100 more on top of 307 at present- over development, 33%

Q53c – boundary – notwithstanding the PC objects to Ford being a hub on the presumption it is a hub Draw FRD011 out of it.

Q53d – site FRD011 – ridge and furrow, mineral safeguarding, Grade 3 agricultural land, safety issues re access, drainage issues.

Want to be consulted on proposals by other parties on the other sites.

Q63 – clusters – no do not add.
