## 1. Apologies

- **2.** Minutes of the meeting held on 26 September 2017 were accepted.
- **3.** Couple of matters arising were discussed:
  - "Bullying update" in the Parish PC Cookson spoke to some children before Christmas regarding unsociable behaviour in the village and no further incidents have been reported.
  - Vandalism to Village Hall Noticeboard- notices ripped down- disappointing.

## 4. Neighbourhood Watch Update/Police Report

Open Day at Pontesbury Police Station on Sat 28<sup>th</sup> October had a disappointing turn out by local residents despite the offer free security marking. However Arthur mentioned that free security marking of farm trailers at cattle markets had been a success.

Arthur stated that 47 separates calls had be logged with 101 from the Parish during the period of 1 November 17 to 22 January 18.

These included incidents:

- Manor crest x 12
- Dinky's Diner (suspicious behaviour) x3
- Traffic RTC in the village (mainly around the snowy periods) x9
- Burglary at the Saffron Curry House x 1
- Cartref caravan park- crossbow fired into park x1
- Children Care Home (pump lane) x1

Arthur also spoke about the rise in thefts of lead off roofs in the Shrewsbury area.

Arthur agreed to pass on some signs regarding "cold callers" to Bill for village welcome packs.

He also shared PC Cookson's work mobile [07814042410] to this group and to be passed onto the Parish Council as an alternative means of contact.

Arthur highlighted the rise in incidents of Electronic Pickpocketing, with criminals using handheld card readers to 'skim' payment details and sensitive information without the victim realising. He passed on some samples of the **Card Defender**.



This is an intelligent card sleeve holder that contains RFID blocking technology that prevents cards from being read, combatting incidents of Electronic Pickpocketing, Card Fraud and Identity Theft.
